RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) SITUATION

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, upon directive of the Office of the President, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease imposed a travel ban covering China, Macau Special Administrative Region (SAR), and Hong Kong SAR. On February 11, 2020, travel restrictions were extended to cover Taiwan on the basis that it was being used as a transit port by passengers from mainland China;

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2020, travel restrictions imposed upon Taiwan were lifted. On February 18, 2020, the IATF also issued Resolution No. 06, series of 2020, granting exemptions in favor of certain classes of travelers traveling to and from China, Hong Kong SAR and Macau SAR;

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2020, the South Korean Government raised its four-tier virus alert to the highest "red" alert level, following a significant increase of confirmed cases and mortality in the country, with Daegu and Chaengdo being declared as "special care zones";

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2020, the Philippine Government received information concerning the M/V Diamond Princess, a cruise ship that was quarantined off the port of Yokohama, Japan due to a COVID-19 outbreak, and that Filipino passengers and crew were on board;

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2020, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) issued Resolution No. 06, series of 2020, approving the Repatriation Plan for the Filipinos aboard M/V Diamond Princess;

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2020, four hundred forty-five (445) repatriates consisting of four hundred forty (440) crew and five (5) passengers of the M/V Diamond Princess arrived in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2020, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) was apprised of the substantial reduction of the availability of pilot and crew for airline operations to and from

China, Hong Kong SAR and Macau SAR as a result of quarantine requirements. Recognizing the equally urgent concern of the airline industry, the IATF designated the Department of Transportation (DOTr), Civil Aeronautics Board (CAB), Bureau of Quarantine (BOQ), and the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) to coordinate and draft the necessary protocols;

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2020, The DOTr, through the CAB, presented before the IATF the proposal to exempt local airline pilots and crew from the strict application of quarantine requirements, subject to the Enhanced Procedures for Flight Deck Cabin Crew and Aircraft Operating in Countries with Travel Restrictions due to COVID-19. In the same IATF meeting, the Bureau of Quarantine manifested that they have already drafted Interim Guidelines for Home Quarantine with Delegated Supervision for Local Airline Crew. Thereafter, the IATF directed the concerned agencies to coordinate and submit a unified draft before the IATF Technical Working Group (TWG);

WHEREAS, on February 19, 2020, the IATF Technical Working Group issued and submitted the Harmonized Protocols for the Relaxation of Travel Ban for Local Pilots and Crew to the IATF;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, that the IATF approves the following:

- A. The following travel restrictions are hereby imposed upon travelers to and from the Republic of Korea, as follows:
 - 1. Any person, except Filipino citizens, including their foreign spouse and children, if any, holders of Permanent Resident Visa, and holders of 9(e) Diplomat Visas issued by the Philippine Government, coming from the North Gyeongsang Province of the Republic of Korea, including Daegu and Cheongdo, shall be temporarily banned from entering the Philippines;
 - 2. Any person, except Filipino citizens, including their foreign spouse and children, if any, holders of Permanent Resident Visa, and holders of 9(e) Diplomat Visas, who, within fourteen (14) days immediately preceding arrival in the Philippines, has been to the North Gyeongsang Province of the Republic of Korea, including Daegu and Cheongdo, shall likewise be temporarily banned from entering the Philippines;
 - 3. Travel to South Korea shall be temporarily suspended, except for Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs), whether returning or newly-hired, upon execution of a

Declaration signifying their knowledge and understanding of the risks involved,

- 4. Those leaving abroad for study, and permanent residents of South Korea shall likewise be allowed to travel to South Korea; and
- 5. The aforementioned provisions shall be effective immediately, subject to close monitoring by the IATF within the next forty-eight (48) hours. Any of the aforementioned provisions shall be subject to regular reassessment;
- B. The Interim Guidelines for Home Quarantine with Delegated Supervision for Local Airline Crew, attached herewith as Annex "A", issued by the BOQ in cooperation with CAB and CAAP Memorandum Circular No. 06-2020, attached herewith as Annex "B" are hereby adopted; and
- C. The Office of the Cabinet Secretary shall hereby form part of the IATF as ex officio member;

INTERIM GUIDELINES FOR HOME QUARANTINE WITH DELEGATED SUPERVISION FOR LOCAL AIRLINE CREW

Public health emergencies in aviation industry can be prevented with full cooperation of all airline personnel with the Bureau of Quarantine.

These following guidelines are emphasized to prevent the spread of diseases classified as Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC):

Guidelines for Quarantine Medical Officers:

- 1. Communicate all necessary advisories through IEC materials on how to prevent the spread of an infectious disease that can occur before boarding, during flight, and after disembarkation.
- 2. Coordinate with the airline medical custodian all flight crew who undergo home quarantine with delegated supervision.
- 3. Conduct physical examination and certify all flight crew who underwent home quarantine with delegated supervision upon its completion.
- 4. Monitor and correct all implementation of all guidelines issued.

Guidelines for Airline Crew:

- 1. For flights that visited a country with a travel ban, the following measures for airline crew must be observed:
 - A. Only Filipinos and holders of Permanent Resident Visa will be included in the passenger list.
 - B. Only asymptomatic passengers will be accepted to board the flight. All symptomatic passengers must be referred back to public health authorities in the port of origin.
 - C. Airline pilot, flight officers, flight purser, and crew must embark prior to passenger embarkation. Pilot and flight officers must go directly in the cockpit to minimize their exposure during passenger embarkation. Flight purser must stay away from passenger movement areas during passenger embarkation.
 - D. All passengers allowed to board are required to wear facemask during embarkation, during the flight, and after disembarkation.
 - E. All crew must wear mask before passenger embarkation, during the flight, and after disembarkation. The mask should be worn continuously, once

















mask is removed during the flight (for example when eating, drinking, or soiled mask), dispose properly and immediately use hand sanitizer and wear a new mask to prevent cross-contamination.

- F. The airline should ensure, through announcements and implementation by crew, that passengers will not transfer from their assigned seats into empty or vacant seats after the cabin door has been closed.
- G. Minimize the number of crew per flight in accordance with minimum standards as recommended and approved by the CAAP, and minimize, as much as possible, the number of crew who will actually engage with passengers during the flight.
- H. Stay in the designated areas of the cabin assigned to them during the flight to avoid contact with passengers and other crewmembers.
- I. Provide engineering control that will disengage on direct contact for flight purser, pilot-in-command and flight officers to the passenger.
- J. Upon arrival in the Philippines, they will be allowed to serve succeeding flights provided they are under close monitoring of respective medical custodian with proper arrangement to dedicated hospital once signs and symptoms arise.
- 2. For flights coming from affected areas with passenger/s manifesting the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 onboard aircraft. The following measures must be observed:
 - A. Implement Protocol on Handling of Infectious Case/s Onboard Aircraft.
 - B. Only the crew assigned to the section of the cabin must engage to the affect passenger. All other crew must maintain their distance in assisting the assigned crew.
 - C. Only the assigned crew will attend to the affected passenger during the flight.
 - D. Upon arrival in the Philippines, the assigned crew is/are not allowed to serve succeeding flights. They will undergo home quarantine with delegated supervision of their respective medical custodian with proper arrangement to dedicated hospital once signs and symptoms arise.
 - E. Observe the fourteen-day compulsory quarantine period. This starts on the last day on their last port visit from countries affected with travel ban.

















- F. Upon completion of the home quarantine with delegated supervision, the Bureau of Quarantine will certify their completion of the fourteen-day quarantine.
- 3. Submit a fully accomplished Health Declaration Checklist (HDC) to the Bureau personnel during the temperature screening at the Quarantine Area.
- 4. Airline crew must watch out for any of these signs and symptoms within fourteen days:
 - A. Measured Fever
 - B. Cough
 - C. Sore throat
 - D. Colds or sneezing
 - E. Difficulty of breathing
 - F. Shortness of breath
 - G. Joint or muscle pains
 - H. Vomiting, or
 - I. Diarrhea
- 5. Report to their designated medical custodian once they manifest the signs and symptoms of COVID-19.

MANDATORY SUBMISSION OF GENERAL

DECLARATION AND HEALTH FORMS

In line with the Philippine Government's measures to contain the spreading of COVID-2019, effective immediately, all Philippine Air Operators conducting operations to and from the Philippines are hereby directed to strictly comply with the directive of the Department of Health - Bureau of Quarantine (DOH-BOQ) to accomplish and submit the General Declaration and Health Forms by all passenger aboard the aircraft including flight deck and cabin crew.

In addition, a General Declaration Form (Annex A) shall be accomplished and signed by the Pilot-in-Command (PIC) whenever there are persons on board with illnesses other than air sickness or who may be suffering from a communicable disease (a fever – 38°C/100°F or greater – associated with one or more of the following signs or symptoms, e.g. appearing unwell; persistent coughing; impaired breathing; persistent diarrhea; persistent vomiting; skin rash; bruising or bleeding without previous injury; or confusion of recent onset, increases the likelihood that the person during a previous stop.

The Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines will closely monitor compliance with this Memorandum Circular. Non-compliance herewith shall subject the erring entity to fines and penalties as provided under Republic Act No. 9497.
